Nick Wolff of CENTURY 21 Wolff Honored for his dedication to the Thomas H. Slater Center of White Plains

On Tuesday, June 12th, at the Thomas H. Slater Center in White Plains, the annual Community Service Award was given to Nick Wolff, Broker/Owner of CENTURY 21 Wolff of White Plains, Mamaroneck, New Rochelle, Hawthorne and Yonkers.
